The hekhhal was commissioned by the Henrique de Castro family and was probably used as the centerpiece of a home synagogue. Lilien was close to Herzl and created the image of Herzl leaning on the balcony so well known from Israeli postage and other places. He was the first artist in the main stream to introduce Jewish looking types into his illustrations. This collection highlights the collection of photographs of Jerusalem and other holy land locations that Lilien took in preparation for his series. "Die Bücher des Bibel."
